- 5. Remember that the adoption of online platforms are meant for educational purposes only. Inappropriate use of technology will not be tolerated.
- 6. Ursuline Academy, and Massachusetts law, forbids students from recording or taking pictures of teachers or other students without consent. Any violation will be subject to disciplinary action as outlined in the Student-Parent Handbook.
